



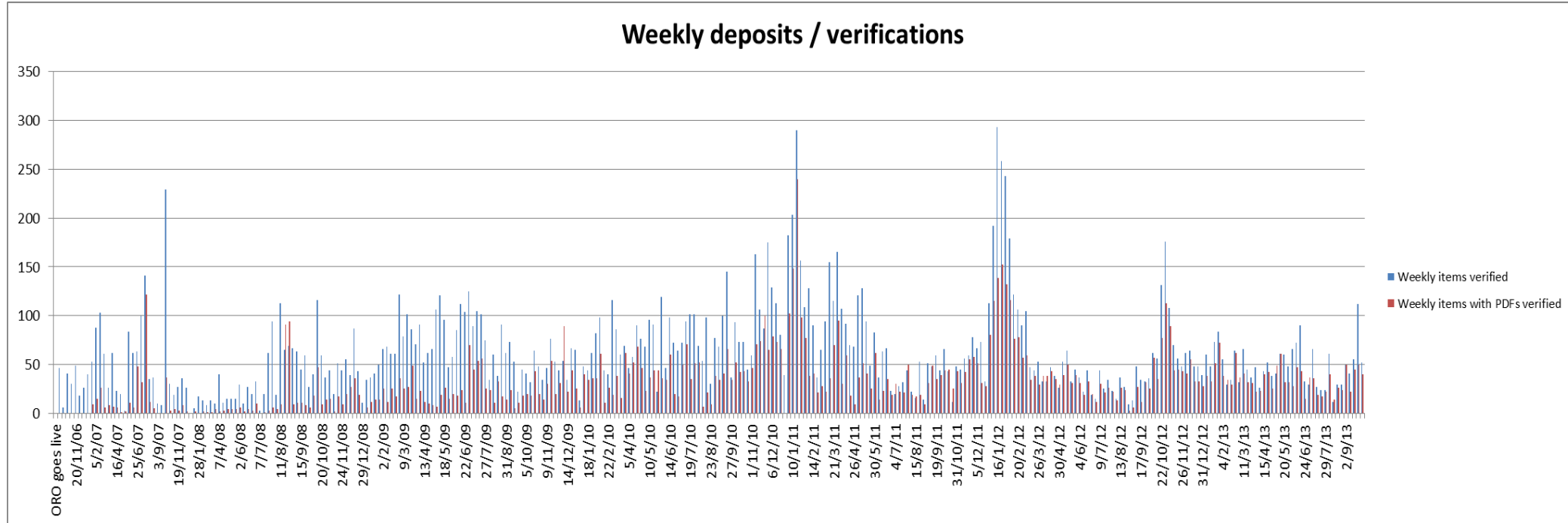

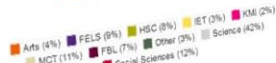

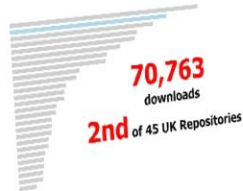

Visitors to ORO by type (%)

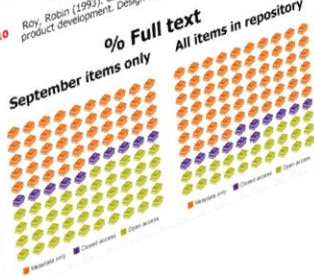

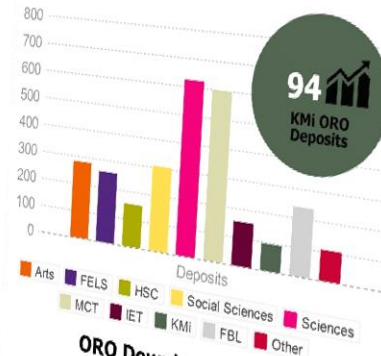

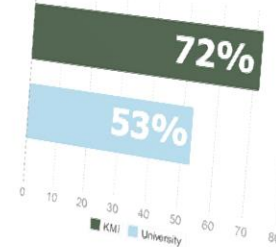

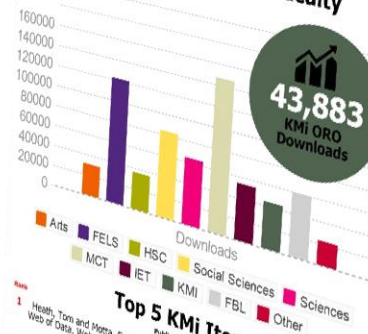
ORO Deposits by Faculty



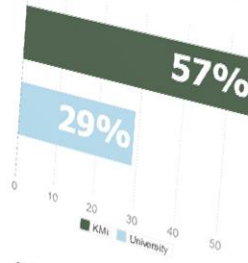
Full Text %

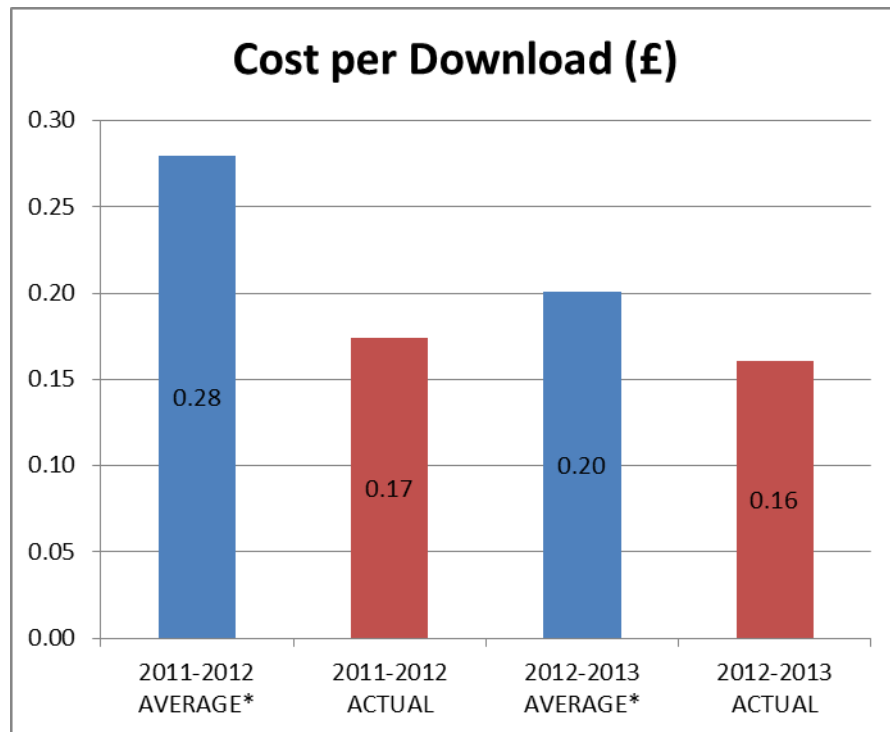

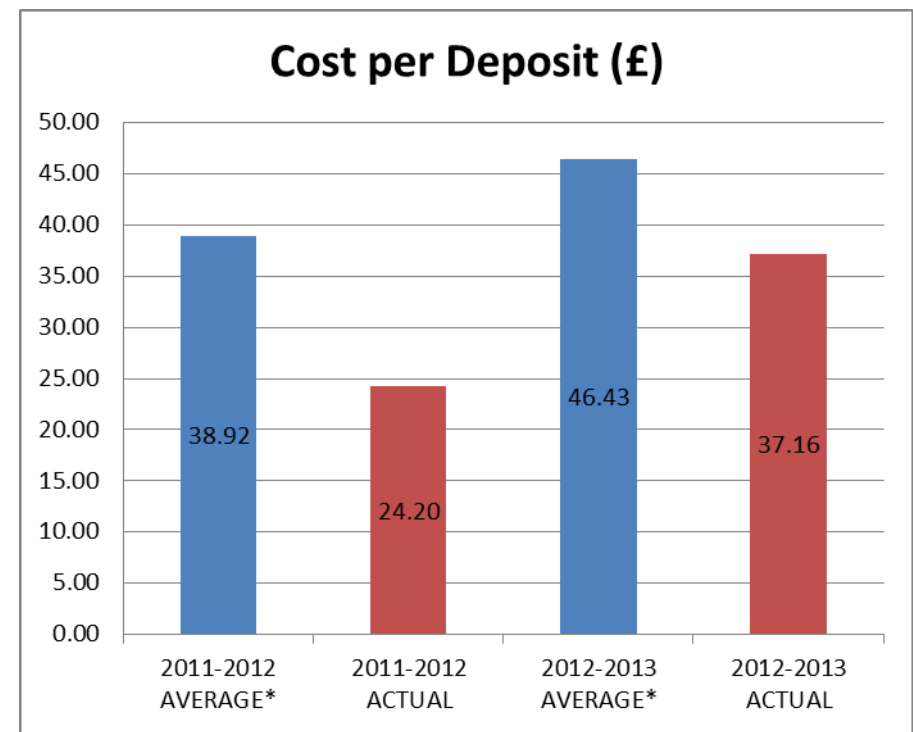

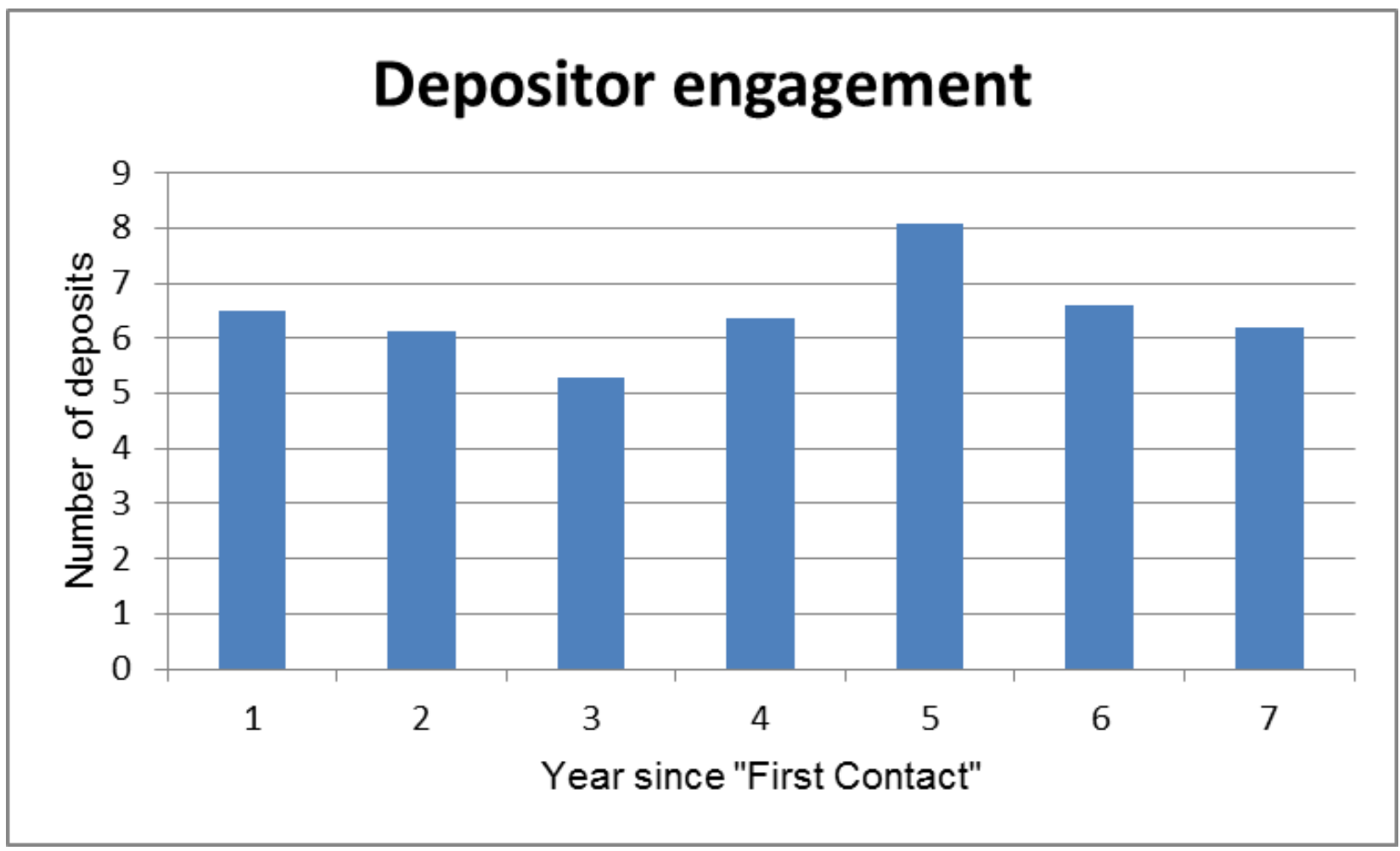
Estimated cost per download
